WHEREAS HIS LATE MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY KING GEORGE THE THIRD, by a Commission under the **GREAT SEAL** of **GREAT BRITAIN**, bearing Date the Eighth Day of November, in the Thirty-first Year of **HIS MAJESTY'S** Reign, was Graciously Pleased to Give and Grant full Power and Authority to the **GOVERNOR** (or in Case of his Death or Absence the **LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR**) for the Time-being of His Majesty's Territory of the **EASTERN COAST OF NEW SOUTH WALES** and the Islands thereunto adjacent, by an Instrument or Instruments in Writing, under the Seal of the Government of the said Territory, or as **HE** or **THEY** respectively should think fit and convenient for His Majesty's Service, to **REMIT** either **ABSOLUTELY** or **CONDITIONALLY** the Whole or any Part of the Term or Time for which Persons convicted of Felony, Misdemeanor, or other Offences, amenable to the Laws of Great Britain, should have been, or should thereafter be respectively Conveyed or Transported to New South Wales or the Islands thereunto adjacent.

BY VIRTUE of such Power and Authority so vested as aforesaid, I, Lieutenant General Ralph Darling, Captain General and Governor in Chief of HM said Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same taking into Consideration the good Conduct of Joseph Turner alias Manchester Turner who arrived in this Colony in the Ship Tottenham -----
----- McDougall Master, in the Year One thousand Eight hundred and Eighteen under Sentence of Transportation for Life
and where description is in the Margin

DO hereby **CONDITIONALLY REMIT** the Remainder of the Term or Time which is yet to come and unexpired of the original Sentence or Order of Transportation passed on the aforesaid Joseph Turner al' Manchester Turner at Derby Sessions O & J and GD. on the twenty fifth Day of September One thousand Eight hundred and Seventeen

PROVIDED ALWAYS, and on Condition, that the said Joseph Turner alias Manchester Turner continue to reside within the Limits of this Government for and during the Space of his original Sentence or Order of Transportation:- Otherwise, the said Joseph Turner alias Manchester Turner shall be subject to all the Pains and Penalties of Re-appearing in Great Britain and Ireland, for and during the Term of his original Sentence or Order of Transportation ; or, as if this Remission had never been granted.
